I sometimes wonder if we take our Christian faith as seriously as we should. What I mean is this. Do we treat our Christian faith like it’s just one aspect of our lives? I have my work life. I have my family life. I have my social life. And I have my faith life. This isn’t how it should be. Our Christian faith is to be the sum total of our lives. It is the rule by which we govern every single aspect of our lives. Every other thing we do finds its reason in connection to Christ.

We have the opportunity to be a part of a small group, where we can have meaningful discussion around the Word of God. This is a chance to interact with brothers and sisters in Christ, to encourage one another, to pray for one another. But, again, many don’t find this important.

I’m not trying to make anyone feel guilty. I am certainly not trying to shame anyone. But, I want us to pursue Christ with all of our hearts. I’ll be talking to you more about this in the days ahead. Until then. . .

The 85th Psalm (v.1-3)

- ¹ O LORD, You showed favor to Your land; You restored the captivity of Jacob.
- ² You forgave the iniquity of Your people; You covered all their sin. Selah.
- ³ You withdrew all Your fury; You turned away from Your burning anger.

Psalm 85 begins with praise to God for His forgiveness and restoration. God had rescued His people from their captivity in Babylon and had brought them back to their homeland – the Promised Land. He answered their repentance with forgiveness and thus, removed His judgment and wrath from them.

Just as God forgave Israel, turned away His fury, and rescued and restored Israel, He now offers this same grace and mercy to us through the Son, Jesus Christ.

It is through Christ that God has shown favor, literally “poured out His many blessings” on us. It is through Christ that He has rescued and restored us from the slavery of sin. It is through Christ’s sacrifice on the cross that God has covered all our sin and forgiven all our iniquity. It is through Christ’s suffering the Father’s full wrath poured out on Him that God’s fury and anger have been turned away from us.
