Caleb's Connections...

Hebrews 3:1

"Therefore, holy brothers and sisters, who share in a heavenly calling, consider Jesus, the apostle and high priest of our confession."

This passage, on the surface, seems like one that is fairly easy to overlook. Coming off of the wonderful praise of Jesus at the end of chapter 2, the writer of Hebrews slows down a little bit and instructs us to "consider Jesus". This word "consider" is the same word that is used in Luke 12:24 where Jesus tells us to "Consider the ravens: They do not sow or reap, they have no storeroom or barn; yet God feeds them. And how much more valuable you are than birds!" To consider something is to slow down and really think about it, to sit down and ponder it. Here Jesus calls us to consider the ravens and the writer of Hebrews leads us to consider Jesus!

Most of us go through life in a rush. We quickly rush to work. We keep running and bustling while we're there. Then we run home as quickly as we can so we can stop and breathe for a second before accomplishing everything else for the day. So often our day is jam packed to the point that we can't stop and think about anything for long. I hope that some of us can take the advice that the writer of Hebrews gives here. I hope we can stop and slow life down a little and truly consider Jesus and all that He has done!
