From the Pastor's Pen...

Jesus was baptized. You probably already knew that. But I wonder if you have ever really thought about it. John the Baptist said it best, "I have need to be baptized by you. Why are you coming to be baptized by me?" Baptism symbolizes repentance and the washing away of sin. Jesus didn't need to repent. He had no sin to be washed away. God, being baptized?! Something about that picture just doesn't seem right. But when you understand it, it becomes a wonderful picture.

At Christmas we celebrate God's Son coming to earth as a child, a human, one of us. He became one of us to save us. There's a connection between Jesus' incarnation (becoming human) and his baptism. Jesus identified himself with those he came to save. He identified himself with us by becoming one of us. By being baptized Jesus identified himself with us as sinners. He had no sin of his own, but he was baptized to show that he was coming to stand in our place as sinners.

Christ was born as a baby that he might grow up to be a man and take our sins upon himself. He became like us so we could one day become like him. May his name be praised forever!

Caleb's Connections... Hebrews 4:14,16

"Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens – Jesus the Son of God – let us hold fast to our confession...let us approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in time of need."

The fact that we have Jesus, the Son of God, serving as our high priest is a fact that warrants all of our praise and affection. Furthermore, He is a high priest that can sympathize with us (verse 15). Jesus was tempted in every way that we are, but in every way was perfect and blameless. And through the sacrifice of Christ, we can be made blameless too! And by accepting the gift of salvation, we can approach the throne of God with boldness, not with fear or shame!

This passage also comes with a calling for us all. The writer of Hebrews urges us to "hold fast to our confession", that is to hold onto our faith in Jesus. To inherit the perfection of Christ, we have to have faith in Christ. If you've never put your trust in Jesus, then this passage doesn't apply. I hope that we all put our faith in the sacrifice of Jesus so that when the time comes we can all approach God with boldness and confidence, knowing that our sins were paid for.
