From the Pastor's Pen...

It is the desire of both Cory and myself that our Sunday worship gatherings would be among the most meaningful and beneficial hours of your week. Caleb's Connections... John 8:34-36

"Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, everyone who sins is a slave to sin. Now a slave has no permanent place in the family, but a son belongs to it forever. So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed."
